














MEAN GIRLS

Nason Hubbard excelled in all of her artistic pursuits at WHS, Including 2D art, music, and theater lighting for Center Stage. Nason is an



Saloni Patel incredibly sk visual artist, specializing Patel


Saloni Patel is an incredibly skilled specializing in oil (and) acrylic painting, charcoal and pastels. Saloni was our Art Club president, and a member of the




Madison Pino

WFAEA's Impact: Funding Grants, Clinicians, and Community Projects



We are thrilled to highlight the significant ways WFAEA has been using its funds to support our community.

Recently, we allocated \$450 to provide lighting and backdrops for the photography studio. This essential equipment enables students to skillfully control and manipulate light, enhancing their ability to create the desired mood, atmosphere, and emphasis in their work.

Additionally, we contributed \$400 towards the purchase of headsets for the auditorium, covering part of the \$1,000 total cost, with the remaining funds provided by a WEF grant. These headsets are crucial for enabling backstage students to communicate effectively with those in the booth during theatrical performances, concerts, and other events.

These initiatives underscore WFAEA's commitment to enriching the educational experiences of our students.

RECORDER WORKSHOP FOR ELEMENTARY STUDENTS

Playing the recorder is an integral part of a third grade music education in the Westborough Public

Schools. This year, Armstrong, Fales, and Hastings Elementary Schools were thrilled to receive joint funding from the Westborough Cultural Council and WFAEA to invite an artist in residence. The Eine Kleine Konsort, a quartet of recorder musicians presented a hands-on workshop for all third grade students on either May 29 or June 3.

The quartet showcases the talents of professional recorder players Jean Burke, Dotty Moffett, Susan Duffy, and Fales' very own Pam Yanco. The group was founded in 1992, and have been traveling to elementary schools all over New England ever since! Their performance is participatory in nature and includes improvisation, blues, and an Orff arrangement of "Ode to Joy". The musicians also take the time to feature the entire consort of recorder instruments from the largest bass recorder, down to the smallest recorder, the garklein.


